The British Ragdoll Cat Club (TBRCC) provides a rehoming service with a network of willing volunteers, including many experienced breeders, situated all over the country, who are ready to help. Over the years, the club has been asked to help rehome Ragdolls when circumstances have changed and owners are sadly unable to keep their cats.

We like to arrange a visit by an experienced member of TBRCC to prospective homes before placing a cat. This ensures that the home suits the needs of the cat/s being considered and also provides the opportunity for adoptees to voice any queries that they may have regarding the general care and upkeep of the Ragdoll breed.

The club receives many adoption enquiries and does not home cats on a first-come/first-serve basis. Each one is assessed individually for its character and temperament and its previous lifestyle is taken into consideration. Therefore, we cannot guarantee that everyone contacting us will be lucky enough to adopt a Ragdoll. When we are certain that we have found the right home, arrangements will be made for the transfer. Please note that you will be asked to sign a rehome agreement and we also ask for a rehome donation for each Ragdoll, depending on age. Often, our expenses are not even covered by this so we do rely on other sources of funding and donations.

Like most pedigree cats, Ragdolls are *indoor cats* and you will be required to provide them with a litter tray. However, if you have a safely enclosed garden, your pet will enjoy playing in the fresh air, especially if you are with him or her.

The Club will always be available to offer ongoing support, not only during the adoption process but also after the placement and throughout the life of the Ragdoll.

The majority of Ragdolls that come into our care are normally middle-aged or older and sometimes have health/behavioural problems. Please consider your own circumstances carefully and be sure you can offer these cats total dedication and the life-long commitment they deserve.

Adopting is not a method of gaining a cheap yet perfect pedigree cat. However, if you decide offering a home to a needy Ragdoll is right for you, we are sure your new companion will repay your love many times over and you will find it a very rewarding experience.
